





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Nordic countries - Municipalities - Population Change between 2001-2021









Nordic population in 2021

- Sweden: 10.4 million
- Denmark: 5.8 million
- Finland: 5.5 million
- Norway: 5.4 million
- Iceland: 370,000

27.5 million people Increase since 2001: 3.4 million

Nordic countries - Municipalities - Population aged 65+ Change between 2001-2021





Nordic population aged 65+

An increase of 46% in the Nordic Region
An increase of more than 40% - slightly less in Sweden
Largest increase in Iceland – 66%

65+ population: 5.5 million Increase since 2001: 1.7 million

Old-age dependency ratio

- Changed from 4.2 to 3.1 in 2001-2021
- Two people per person aged 65+ in rural Finland



- Age composition


Adapting capacity to demand

Lolland ticks all the boxes


